ISP offers overnight retreats and spiritual reflection programs based in Ignatian spirituality and the 12 step tradition for people rebuilding their lives from homelessness and substance use addiction. Though founded in the Jesuit tradition, ISP welcomes people of all (or no) faith backgrounds. Our programs invite participants to take time away to deepen their relationship with the God of their understanding, gently name the places inside that need healing, and bond with others on the recovery journey.

Dorothy's story

In 2018, I was coming out of the hardship of drug addiction. I had nowhere to turn, I didn't know which way to go, and I didn't have much to live for. I was staying in a halfway house full of chaos—until I was invited on my first ISP retreat. That retreat changed my life, and I believe God led me straight there.



After only 2 days on retreat, I started to feel hope. I found God in the place of quiet and peace, the sharing, the experience of the care of the facilitators, and especially the witness talk where I saw mirrored my own story of abandonment

That night, the witness on the retreat came to talk to me. She asked me about my future, where I wanted to go from there. She could have gone to talk to any of the other women, but she came to me. I truly believe it was all the work of God. It was a beautiful weekend.

I received so much hope from my retreat experience that I wanted to stay connected to ISP and to

give back. Today, I am a witness and facilitator for my ISP retreat team and an Ambassador of Hope. I get to share my hope and share how I live my faith with my higher power. I'm learning new ways to listen, to observe others and their feelings. I just love this community!

Anthony's story



I discovered Ignatian spirituality and did the Spiritual Exercises with my spiritual director. I was amazed at the overlap with the 12 step spiritual fitness program. Thus, I did a Google search for AA 12 steps and Ignatian spirituality and BOOM ISP showed up. I have been involved ever since that day, and love the overlap that helps me grow and blossom in God's light.

The ability to be present for participants as they walk through a spiritual retreat

has had a great impact on me. I remember one guy named Joe, a 60 year old man from Washington DC

living in transitional housing, who joined us in 2019 for a retreat. He had never been out of DC in his life. When he saw his retreat room overlooking the Potomac River he grabbed me from behind and with tears streaming down his face said: 'Thank you, this is the most beautiful place I have ever been in my life.' **The God in Joe spilled all over me that day** and I was the beneficiary of His presence.



Kevin's story

As a case manager for people who were homeless and suffered from substance use addiction, I knew lots of stories, lots of excuses, lots of ways to hide, lots of means of deception. I used that knowledge and became darned good at masking my own behaviors, hiding and isolating. I was in and out of recovery programs, but I always went back out.

At one point, with no place else to go, I ended up in a homeless shelter myself. It was at this shelter that I first heard about ISP: 'Who is that?' 'What is that?' I wondered. It wasn't long before I met Larry, an ISP leader, who eventually became my spiritual mentor. I went to ISP gatherings and



"If I hadn't found ISP, I question whether I would've made it." spiritual reflections. Eventually Larry asked if I would be a witness at an ISP retreat. After giving my witness and being on that retreat I could see that this was the start and the middle of something that would have no end.

If I hadn't found ISP, I question whether I could have made it. I could never stay sober because there was a component of sobriety that was missing—spirituality.

While drinking, I recall thinking that any given person's life was worth about \$2.99. If I could get \$2.99 from this person (the cost of a bottle of vodka) then I could go on living. **Now, I can see the infinite depth of value of each person of God. What a joyful difference!** ISP has given me this gift of God.

Cathy's story



Witnessing the different gifts brought by each team member has been a gift of the Holy Spirit. I have witnessed God's gifts through each of these women. 




FISCAL YEAR END JUNE 30, 2023

In FY23, ISP invested in additional staff to lay the foundation for program growth and financial sustainability. The Board of Directors approved the release of a portion of ISP's reserves fund to cover these short-term deficits as we create a runway for future growth.


Total: \$877,278¹
